Biennial Conference Points To A New Direction

Rev. Law went on to share a vision of unity for the AECC at the 2022 Biennial International Conference in Indianapolis, IN, on August 19-20. But the conference was about more than redirection, it was also about renewal and refreshment- "An R3 Conference." Renewal and refreshment came with the fantastic worship and prayer, the fellowship and the good food that was part of the conference. A wonderful Friday evening banquet allowed everyone to visit.

The Holy Spirit truly used Jeannie Ortega Law and Wayne Lundberg as they led worship throughout the conference. Also, keynote speakers, Curt Smith and Wade Mantlo, were very informative as they shared key current information we could all take back home with us. Good information was also shared by each of the breakout speakers- Rev. Jesse Bingaman, Rev. J.B. Kump, Rev. Merle R. Fredericks, and Pastor Charles Reynolds. One of the comments heard following the 45 minute sessions was that they could have been longer!

Not only did the conference focus on renewal, refreshment and redirection, it was a time to honor those who are serving and give recognition for accomplishments. It was with a great deal of emotion and respect that Dr. Charles Wasielewski, Sr. was honored with the Presidential Emeritus Award, an engraved gavel, for his service to the AECC as a former president, and Dr. Lowell Ford was presented the Lifetime Service Award and a framed certificate for his service on the board and dedication to the AECC.

Two members were ordained- Michael Kilpatrick and Merle Fredericks, and a graduation ceremony was held for five graduates of the American Evangelical Bible College-Jesse Bingaman (Doctor of Ministry); Merle Fredericks (Pastoral Certificate), Brian Jacques (Pastoral Certificate), Deborah Weber (Bachelor of Arts in Religious Education) and Tina Zubady (Bachelor of Arts in Ministry).

The conference closed following a focused healing and prayer session, and a fellowship time on Saturday. Plans are already underway for the next biennial conference!

Our men and women of the AECC answer that call and use the purpose that God has given them to change the world.

The AEBC is here to help develop Holy Spirit-empowered leaders to go where there is darkness and need for the light of the world, Jesus Messiah. Students will learn to hear God's voice by deepening their relationship with Him and listening for His voice.

There is a true story of a Pastor named Bill Wilson. When he was 12 his mother abandoned him. She told him to stand on a corner to meet her and he stood there for three days, she never came back to get him. One man who was going to visit his son in the hospital, seeing Bill, stopped to ask him if there was something he could do for him. Bill told him the story and the man got him something to eat and made arrangements to send him to a Christian Camp. It was there he met Jesus; it was not easy for him. When he went to the camp, no one really wanted much to do with him as he smelled and his clothes were dirty. But when they asked if anyone wanted prayer at the altar, he went and no one prayed with him. Instead, all alone, he went to the altar and attempted his own prayer to God: "My mother doesn't want me. The Christians don't want me. But if you want me, here I am." God definitely wanted him. As time went on, he went to seminary and became a Pastor. He began a ministry and in 1980, he established Metro World Ministry in Bushwick, Brooklyn. At the time, Bushwick was one of New York's toughest neighborhoods, known for its gang violence, crime, drugs, and poverty. Armed with a bull horn, a station wagon, and Yogi Bear costumes, Bill went through the streets inviting and driving children to his fun, welcoming Sunday School

program. He outgrew the station wagon and eventually got some used trucks from the place his ministry was housed in, an old brewery. He converted them into stages and did sidewalk Sunday School. God blessed his ministry and now all five boroughs have sidewalk Sunday School.

During this time one lady who spoke very little English accepted Jesus and wanted to help anyway that she could. At this time buses had been purchased so more kids could come to Sunday School. Pastor Bill told the lady to pick a different bus each week to ride with the kids. She did and she would usually put the one kid who was all alone or shy on her lap. As she spoke very little English, she would just repeat, "I love you; Jesus loves you." After awhile she found one little boy that she was so fond of she only rode that bus so she could hold him. He never made a sound but she continued to tell him, "I love you; Jesus loves you." One day as he was leaving, he talked and said to her, "I-I love you." He put his little arms around her and gave her a big hug. The next day his little body was found in a garbage bag under the fire escape, his mother had beat him to death and thrown his body in the trash. "I love you; Jesus loves you" were some of the last words he heard in his short life, from someone who could barely speak English.

People need to see the reality of the Gospel. For some, like this little boy you are the only Scripture they will read. You are the only sermon they will ever see. You are the hands and voice of the Savior; one person can make a difference.

We all want a deeper relationship with our Savior. If the AEBC can help you, please contact me.

The Southeast, Region 5 held its annual meeting on August 6, 2022. The meeting was held at a hotel in Orlando, Florida. There were eight in attendance.

Our guest speaker was Wade Mantlo, who spoke on "Discipleship and the Church." This was actually a prelude to his presentation for the AECC Biannual Conference.

Other speakers were Pastor Dan Zahn, Pastor Michael Kilpatrick and AECC President, Reverend Renn Law.

The conference gave all attendees a well-deserved opportunity for fellowship, a learning experience about church discipleship and the future direction of the AECC.





AFRICAN MISSIONS FOR CHRIST REPORT

A pleasant good evening from African Missions for Christ,

This is Evangelist Oluwafeyihanwa Theresa McElroy reaching out on behalf of myself and Rev. Russell, the Director of AMFC. We thank you for your prayers, encouragement and financial support. We spent a little over a month in the Machinga district, a densely Islamic populated part of Malawi sowing Gospel seed, preaching the Gospel and showing the love of Jesus Christ.

The following is a brief account of what God did through You and Us:

- 1) We had three open air crusades and planted three churches which were handed over to reputable overseers of different denominations to disciple and equip for the work of the ministry.
- 2) We commissioned two deep wells. One well will be used by nine villages and the other well will irrigate a hectare farm and provide drinking water for Chabwera villagers.
- 3) We had three days with all expenses paid for the Pastors Conference. Forty-five village pastors attended and they were blessed as their eyes were opened to the word of God in a new dimension.
- 4) We had Fathers Table almost everyday with 200 to 400 neighborhood children. On the last day of Papa's table we fed 500+ children with rice and beans in reusable plastic plates for them to keep on using at home.
- 5) We had three eyeglasse clinics where several hundreds of people were examined and given reading glasses.
- 6) We donated computers and books to Machinga Secondary School which is actually next to our base. They were very grateful indeed because the school only has one computer in their computer lab for over 200 students.
- 7) We had a youth Jamboree. We prepared for 100 to 150 youth, over 400 showed up for music, fun, basketball and most importantly the Gospel.
- 8) Counting the Canaan Land Choir, we had a big choir festival with 20 choirs participating.
- 9) We had delegations of Missionaries who visited and fellowshipped with the Church on top of Chaoni Mountain

while some of us fellowshipped, commissioned and handed over the Church at Nikongolo Village situated at the bottom of the Cahoni Mountain. The Church was handed to Flowing Grace Ministries. We also visited a Church that was started by AMFC but is standing on its own with the pastor. The Church needs 50,000 bricks @ 1.5 cent per brick. We were able to donate 20,000 bricks to help them out.

- 10) We visited and blessed two overcrowded prisons. Rev. Russell preached the word and hundreds came to the saving grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. Prisoners were fed, given blankets, soap, plates and hand sanitizers.
- 11) We were privileged to baptize 22 people from two affiliated Churches.
- 12) We had 10 days of school Evangelism with 32 schools in the furthest remote area of Machinga with strong islamic beliefs. To the Glory of God we ministered to over 25,000 Students with over 75% decisions for Christ.
- 13) We visited and donated over 30,000 N95 face masks to Machinga District Hospital, several boxes of hand sanitizers and a few other items and medication.
- 14) We thank God for your donations of rice, peanut butter and jelly. We are thankful for the funds to purchase exercise books and pens. Everyone we encountered was fed at least one meal.
- 15) Dignity for Village Girls is always a sell out and the highlight of the school evangelism program for the girls.
- 16) We dedicated a peacemaker farm, plus hectare land, donated to AMFC for all year farming in order to prevent hunger. We started the clearing of the land and took time to look into equipping the land with a tractor and two deep wells to provide continuous water for irrigation.

I will stop here because we did more and blessed thousands of men, women and children with all your donations. We are in the process of sponsoring a young man to IT School.

To God alone be the Glory. The multipurpose hall is almost completed because of your donation. We are eternally grateful to you. We pray for you twice daily.
